



## MONEY, MONEY, MONEY Employment Support (SLES)

At Your Enabled Services we understand leaving school and entering adulthood can be a big step. If you are in year 12 or of school leaver age and eligible for the NDIS, then we can help you develop skills to build confidence and independence.

Our **Money, Money, Money Program** will develop a core set of skills that will help you for engaging in your community. The program also contains components of travel training and community access.

### What is SLES?

SLES is a National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) funded support. It's designed to assist young people find meaningful employment once they leave school by building their skills, independence, and confidence.

SLES is about laying the foundations a young person will need to engage with employers now and into their future - and building their capacity to live an independent life. While SLES supports are tailored to the individual's situation, support needs, and employment goals, the skills our Money, Money, Money program can help you develop include:

#### FINANCE 101

- Recognising money.
- Income and expenses.
- Protecting money.
- Borrowing money.
- Saving money.

#### FINANCE 102

- Explanation of a bank card and its application.
- Ways to pay bills online, and in person.
- Understanding your mobile phone plan.
- APPs for budgeting.
- You Tube links.

#### FINANCE 103

- Online two-hour course with video modules
- Cash flow, tax, and budgeting.
- Quizzes and surveys to test your knowledge and reflect on your progress.
- Access to an exclusive Facebook community

### Who is eligible for SLES?

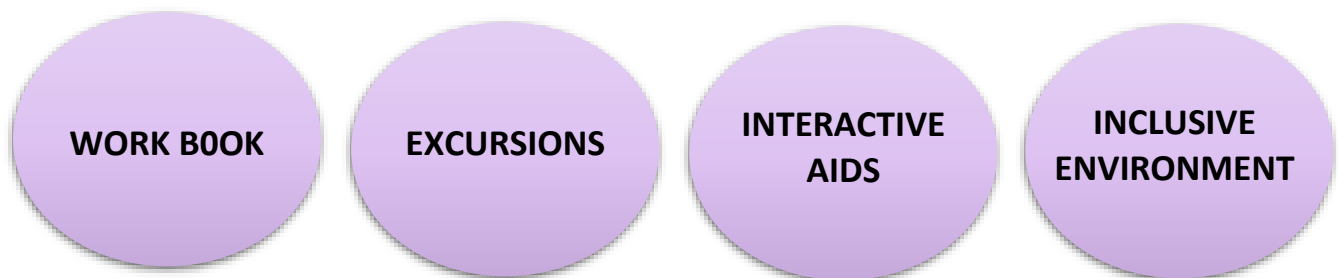
SLES is available to NDIS participants who are about to leave, or have recently left, school and would like some extra assistance making the transition to working life. While the supports are typically aimed at year 12 students, anyone who's legally old enough to leave school can access them. This is usually around year 10, but this varies depending on which state or territory you're living in. In most cases, the cut-off age for SLES eligibility is 22.

## What to Expect

Classes will be capped at 8 participants, with one trainer and one coach. Alternatively, individual sessions can be tailored to your learning style, using your strengths to build capacity, skills, and knowledge to support your growth.

We'll regularly update your support network on your progress, providing them with the tools to assist you to maximise your chance of success.

Participants will be provided with a workbook and will get real life opportunities to solidify the learning content on excursions and with interactive aids.



## COSTS and NDIS Funding

It comes down to the NDIS Plan and personal goals, and the strategies in place to reach these goals. Eligible funds will be available in capacity building or a stated support like SLES or Core funding.
